Following the implementation of the Government's step four of their covid-19 road map, the Department for Education have made clear their expectation is that all schools will be open for all pupils from September with lower levels of control and greater scope for activity to continue as normal. However, the remaining four elements of the PHE-Endorsed 'system of controls' remain important and are reflected in this risk assessment.

The four remaining elements are:

- 1. Ensure good hygiene for everyone
- 2. Maintain appropriate cleaning regimes
- 3. Keep occupied spaces well ventilated
- 4. Follow public health advice on testing, self-isolation and managing confirmed cases of covid-19

Schools must apply the system of controls in a way that reduces risk to the lowest, reasonably practicable level, in a way that works for their school and allows them to deliver a broad and balanced curriculum for pupils.

		2 x 4 = 8	1a Clean hands thoroughly more often than usual Covid-19 is an easy virus to kill when it is on skin. This can be done with soap and running water or hand sanitiser. Only use alcohol hand rub or sanitiser if soap and water not available.	School is taking steps to ensure that all pupils and staff wash hands regularly: when they arrive at school, when they return from breaks, when they change rooms and before and after eating, and after coughing or sneezing. No longer need to take temperatures on arrival. Cough/sneeze into tissue and throw away or into crux of elbow – not onto hands. We are promoting hand washing through posters and regular reminders and building it into school routines and behaviour expectations. We demonstrate good hygiene practice. We make use of resources from e-bug and other sources available regarding educating children on good hygiene. We provide alcohol-based hand sanitiser where a sink is not readily available, and supervise it given the risks around ingestion. We have alcohol-based hand sanitiser dispensers in all classrooms, hall spaces, communal areas and corridors in school to enable children, staff and visitors to maintain good hand hygiene at all times. We ensure pupils who need supervision and/or help whilst washing hands receive it.	1 x 4 = 4

2 x 4 = 8	1b Ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach. N.B. Staff and Pupils are permitted to wear face coverings if they wish.	We ensure that all have enough tissues and bins available in the school to support pupils and staff to follow this routine. We talk to all pupils and staff about respiratory and hand hygiene. We empty bins at midday and the end of every school day. Some pupils with complex needs struggle to maintain as good respiratory hygiene as their peers. This is considered in risk assessments in order to support these pupils and the staff working with them. • Face mask/visors are optional – for parents as well as staff (no one should be judged) • Face masks to be worn in enclosed/crowded spaces/when not enough ventilation • Staff must wear them when talking to parents/visitors or with people that they normally do not meet	1 x 4 = 4
2 x 4 = 8	2. Introduce enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often using standard products, such as detergents and bleach. Products used should be capable of killing covid-19, but must be used safely and in line with manufacturers instructions /	with people that they normally do not meet. We have Identified surfaces that are regularly touched – such as desks, chairs, keyboards, handles, light switches etc. We instruct and ensure supervision of cleaning staff accordingly. We have appropriate COSHH assessments in place to ensure that products are used safely. We have put in place a cleaning schedule that ensures cleaning is generally enhanced and includes: o more frequent cleaning of rooms / shared areas that are used by different groups frequently touched surfaces being cleaned more often than normal toilets being cleaned regularly and pupils are encouraged to clean their hands thoroughly after using the toilet Cleaning of external touch points at midday If symptoms have been in a room, this will have a deeper clean. Pink cleaning fluid and cloths to be available in all rooms, these will be replace and the cloths will be replaced daily and the fluid checked daily.

(artificial and natural) and have set heating/ventilation systems accordingly. • Windows remain open in every room • If car sharing – ensure good ventilation • Staff/pupils are allowed to wear warm clothing (if necessary) to facilitate this.	

2 x 4 = 8	4a. Minimise contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have covid-19 symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school N.B. There will always be residual risk from those who are asymptomatic.	We communicate with pupils and staff that if they have displayed covid-19 symptoms and/or have tested positive for covid-19 in the last 10 days they must not attend school. We communicate with parents that if pupils have displayed Covid-19 symptoms and/or have tested positive for covid-19 in the last 10 days they must not attend school. We communicate with staff, students and others that if they are displaying symptoms, they must get tested for covid-19 by booking a PCR test. We communicate with visitors and contractors, that access to site is only possible with no covid-19 symptoms. They must follow school procedures and practices and (where appropriate) carry out a separate risk assessment. We continue to communicate to students, staff and parents that households should isolate for 10 days if someone in the household displays symptoms or they are told to by NHS Track and Trace. (As appropriate within current rules around those under 18 years and four months or those who are vaccinated, which are subject to change) • Staff should isolate until they've had a negative PCR test if they have been in close contact of someone who has a positive test. • Pupils with symptoms should be supervised by a member of staff in full PPE – either outside or in a room that can be ventilated, e.g physio room. School is implementing the current DfE advice on LFT testing for staff. • Staff are asked if they will do tests twice a week, Sunday and Wednesday evenings.	1 x 4 = 4

Response to infection Engage with NHS Track and Trace	 We ensure that staff members and parents/carers understand that they will need to be ready and willing to: book a PCR test if they are displaying symptoms provide details of anyone they have been in close contact with if they were to test positive for covid-19 or if asked by NHS Test and Trace self isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who develops covid-19 symptoms or someone who tests positive for covid-19 (As appropriate within current rules around those under 18 years and four months or those who are vaccinated, which are subject to change) Staff should isolate until they've had a negative PCR test if they have been in close contact with someone who has a positive test. Anyone who displays symptoms of covid-19 can and should get a PCR test. If anyone displays symptoms whilst in school they should follow the Trust procedure "Dealing with Confirmed or Suspected Cases" 	1 x 4 = 4
